MOBILIZING COMMUNITY ACTIVISTS & ACTIVISM

to create a just society that welcomes, supports, protects, and respects all persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Key Measures of Success

An increase in the number of points of contact to at least 1.5 million

EMPLOYEE REPRESENTATION

An increase in the number of employees with developmental disabilities working at The Arc of King County

COMPENSATION & REIMBURSEMENTS

Additional monies for persons with developmental disabilities to speak in the community, participate in coalitions and fully participate in community mobilization efforts

COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION:

An increase in the numbers of people involved in Advocacy Days developed and coordinated by The Arc of King County

WORKSHOP PARTICIPANTS:

An increase in the numbers of workshops offered and the numbers of people participating.

FINANCIAL RESOURCES

An increase in the numbers of grant applications and available dollars for emerging community needs

AVAILABLE HOURS OF SUPPORT:

An increase in total number of hours of available support offered to customers

PRIVATE PAY CUSTOMERS:

An increase in the number of private-pay customers

THE WINGS PROGRAM

An increase to two episodes/events annually

PARTICIPATE IN COALITIONS deploying trained activists to specific community groups with agenda that advance persons with development disabilities

identifying and engaging a list key community individuals, businesses and organizations in strategic relationships

LEADERSHIP that offers a methodology for developing, cultivating and rewarding leadership for persons with developmental disabilities

CREATE A UNIFIED VOICE FOR INCLUSION

speaking out that all voices are to be welcomed, included and respected especially in workplaces and by employers and fellow employees

ADVANCE AN ANNUAL LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

publishing position papers, taking public stances, and speaking out on or proposing measures that respect the needs and full participation of persons with developmental disabilities

as the most comprehensive resource center for providing technical assistance related to intellectual and development disabilities available in King County
